 2013 update - Auburn Hills is still exploring the opportunity to work with Pontiac (now controlled by Oakland County) to become more efficient and reduce the City's dependence on DWSD.

Auburn Hills is looking at the possibility of buying excess water capacity from the City of Pontiac to offset the 100% exclusive relationship with DWSD. This agreement would benefit Pontiac with current asset utilization and be an additional revenue stream for Pontiac. Auburn Hills would benefit by being able to purchase water at a lower rate than what is currently contracted with DWSD.

Update February, 2014
 The goal for 2014 is for the four communities (Auburn Hills, Pontiac, Orion Township, and Rochester Hills) to develop an inter-agency that becomes the North Oakland County Water Authority that has the impact of reducing DWSD revenue requirement for the four communities.
 If the new authority agreement can be developed and approved by the governing boards of the respective communities in 2014, the next phase would be develop a connecting water line with Pontiac in 2015-2016. If this project is successful it is expected that the savings for the four communities could be as much as \$3.0 million.
 No barriers currently exist for project to move ahead.

 The primary barrier or reason for dropping was due to differences of opinion in how to proceed among the managers that prevented the project from moving beyond a conceptual stage.

 The Communities of Practice was initiated by the city managers/mayors of seven Oakland County communities and Oakland University as a pilot program with the intention of cooperating and collaborating in the implementation of best local government management practices. Continuation of the program became difficult as conflicts hindered scheduling and administering the program through Oakland University became challenging as communication broke down.
 As the purpose behind the original pilot program remains highly relevant to overcoming the challenges faced by municipalities, the City of Troy will contact the participating municipalities with the intention of re-developing the program in a new and more relevant format that will provide a greater benefit than that of the pilot program.

Goal of project is improve overall appearance of the University Drive corridor and establish a clear shared connection between both public entities.
 The improvements will include, but not be limited to, addition of elevated planters, landscape enhancements, artistic and decorative signage, banners, tree replacements, and improvements to the appearance of the light and traffic signal poles.
 Phase I of the project started in late 2013 with the light and traffic signal pole improvements. The balance of the Phase I will be completed in 2014. Phase I of the project has a total budget of \$400,000 and each party will share equally in the cost.
 Phase II of the project is tentatively scheduled for 2015, and the exact project scope (expected to total to \$200,000) and timing are currently being discussed by the two parties.

The City has received a funding award in 2015 for the Squirrel Road reconstruct project from Walton Boulevard to Dutton Road.
